IX THINGS

Invite your college or university's President, Title IX Coordinator, or Dean of Students to your Brave Miss World Screening and BraveSpeak discussion afterwards.

Participate in the "I Am Brave" campaign by sharing your experiences as a survivor or ally on Facebook and Twitter. Use the hashtag #IAmBrave to engage with others worldwide who are speaking out against sexual violence.

Ask for help if you feel you need it. Talk to a friend. Educate yourself about campus sexual violence. Check out KnowYourlX.org and EndRapeOnCampus.org to learn more.

Look up your school's sexual assault policy and resources; then share the information with your friends. If you can't find any, talk to your administration.

Host or attend a violence prevention training, Sexual Assault Response 101 training, or Title IX training on your campus. Share the #IAmBrave campaign with those in attendance.

Have open, honest conversations with your partner about consent and what everyone involved wants to do in sexual situations.

When you hear a "rape joke," use that opportunity to educate; have a conversation instead of laughing along.
